Crime Statistics

- Based on Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System (TIBRS) Released 04/13/2017
- Rounded to whole numbers
- Based on Uniform Crime Report (UCR) Index Crimes:
 - Violent Crimes: Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault
 - Property Crimes: Arson, Auto Theft, Burglary, and Larceny
- Statistics back to 2005 are based on UCR Reports



Highlights

- 2015 to 2016
- Overall Crime showed a 16% Reduction
- Violent Crime showed a 13% Reduction
- Property Crime showed a 16% Reduction



Highlights

- 2014-2016
- Started the Violent Crime Initiative in 2014 with multiple partnerships
- Overall Crime down 30%
- Violent Crime Down 27%
- Property Crime down 31%



Trend Since 2005

- From 2005 to 2016
- Overall Crime Down 46%
- Violent Crime Down 54%
- Property Crime Down 44%



Highlights

- Emergency Response Time (Dispatch to Arrival): 1 Minute, 2 Secs
- Clearance Rate: 54.38% State Average: 40.5%

- Arrests: 1,251
- Citations: 4,818 Plus 540 Warning Citations

- Traffic Crashes: 935 Hit & Runs: 166
- Total of 20,245 Calls for Service: About a 29% reduction



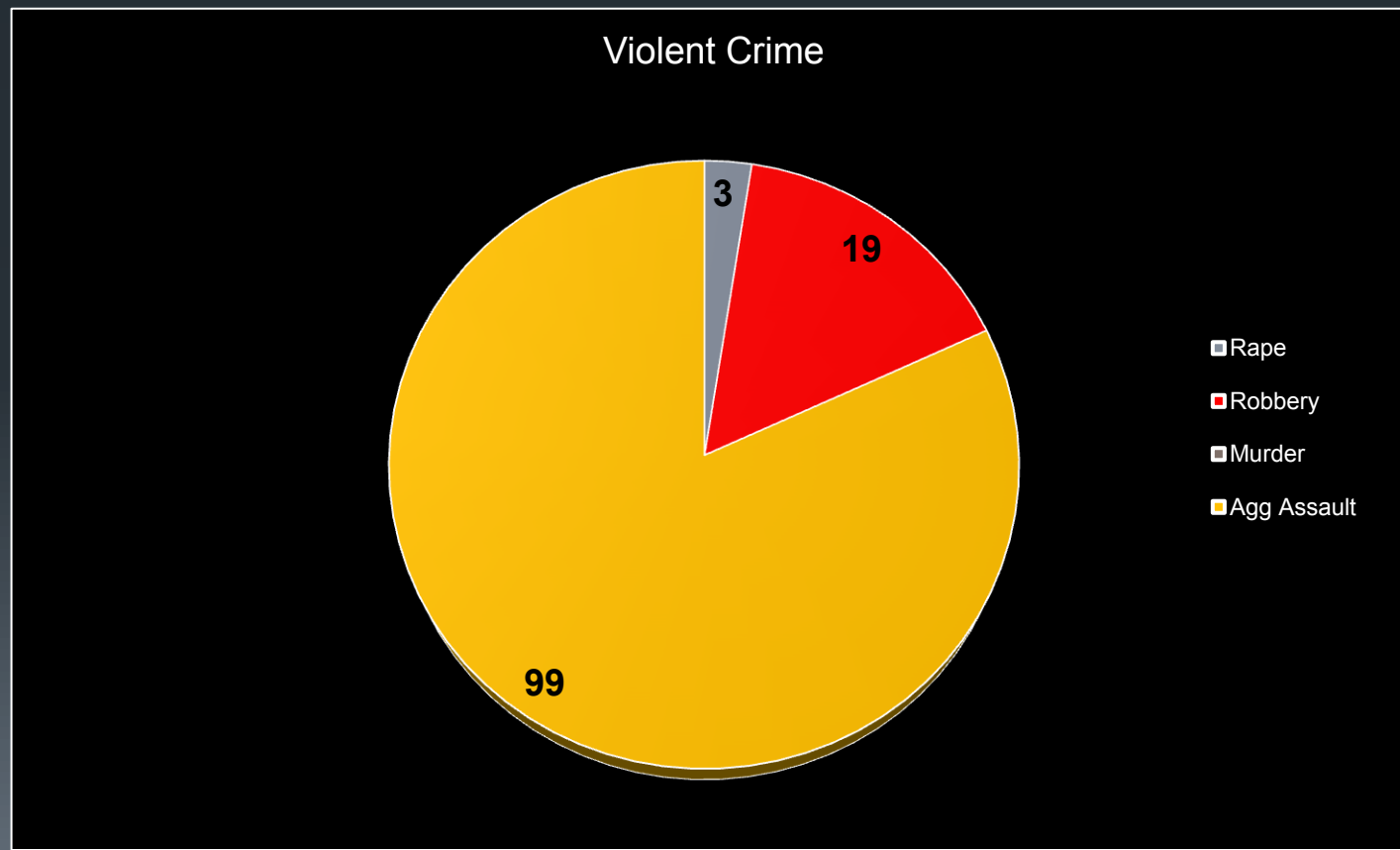

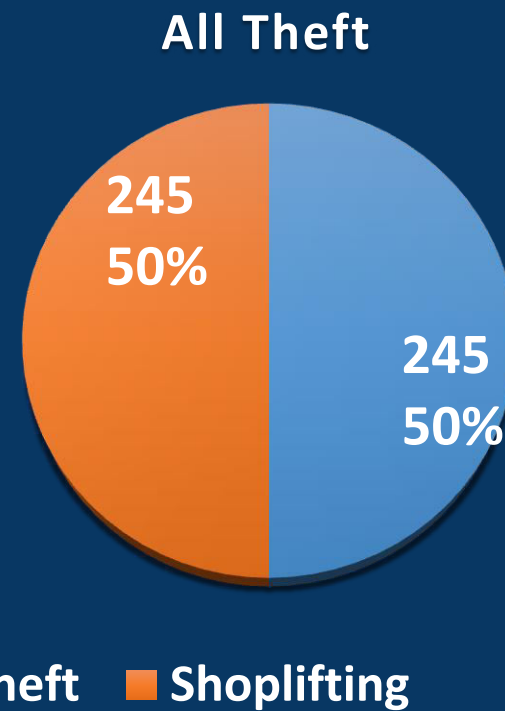
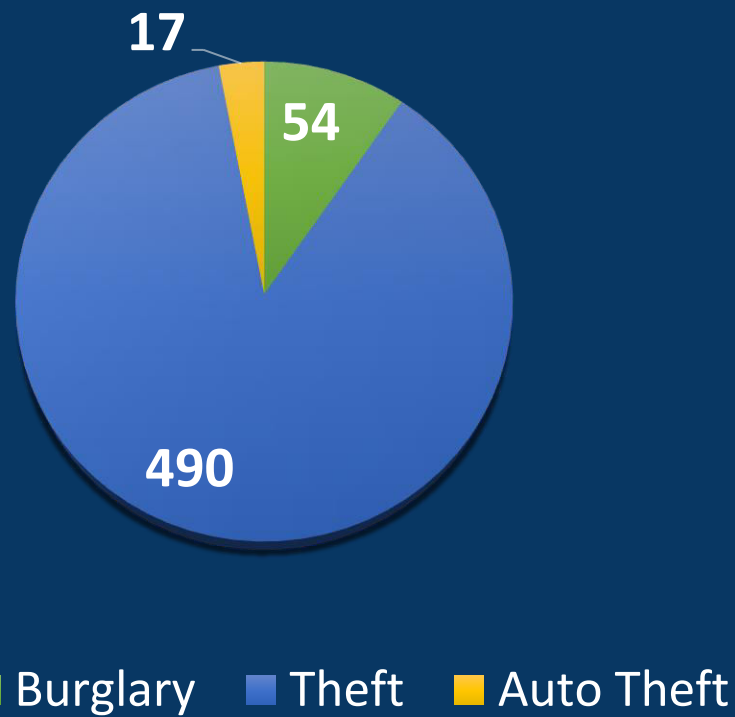

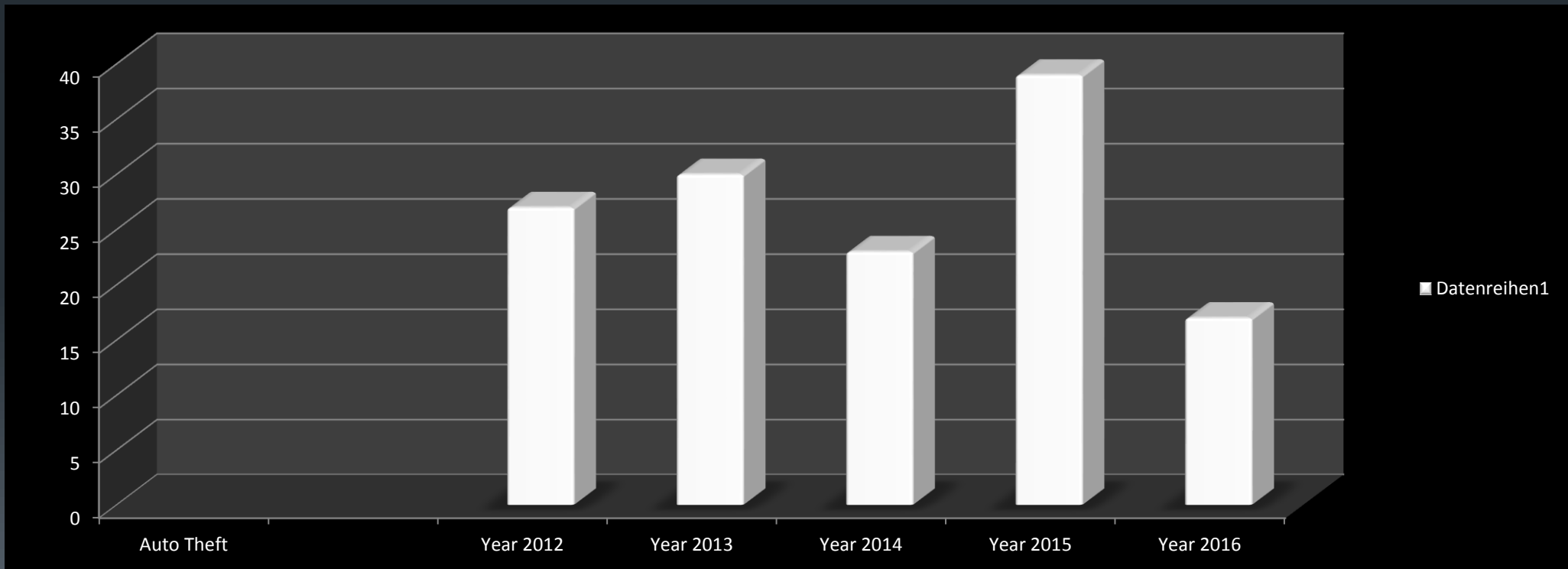
Violent Crime Trends



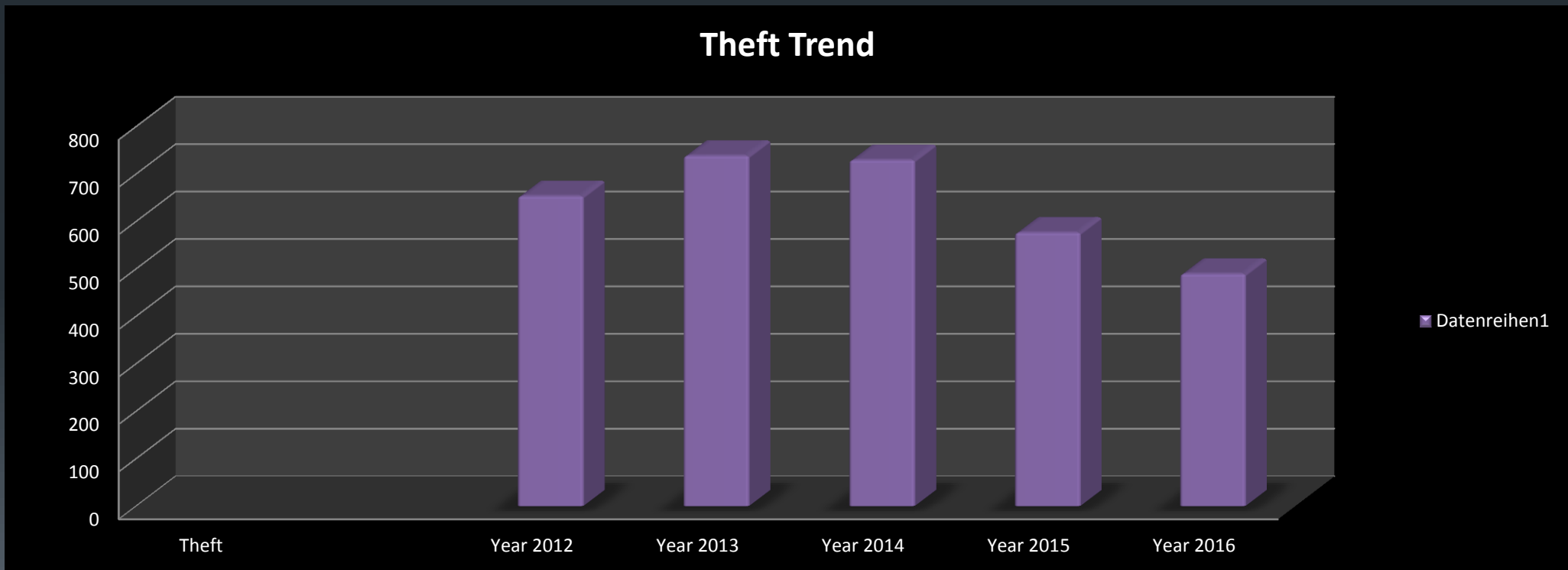
Property Crimes



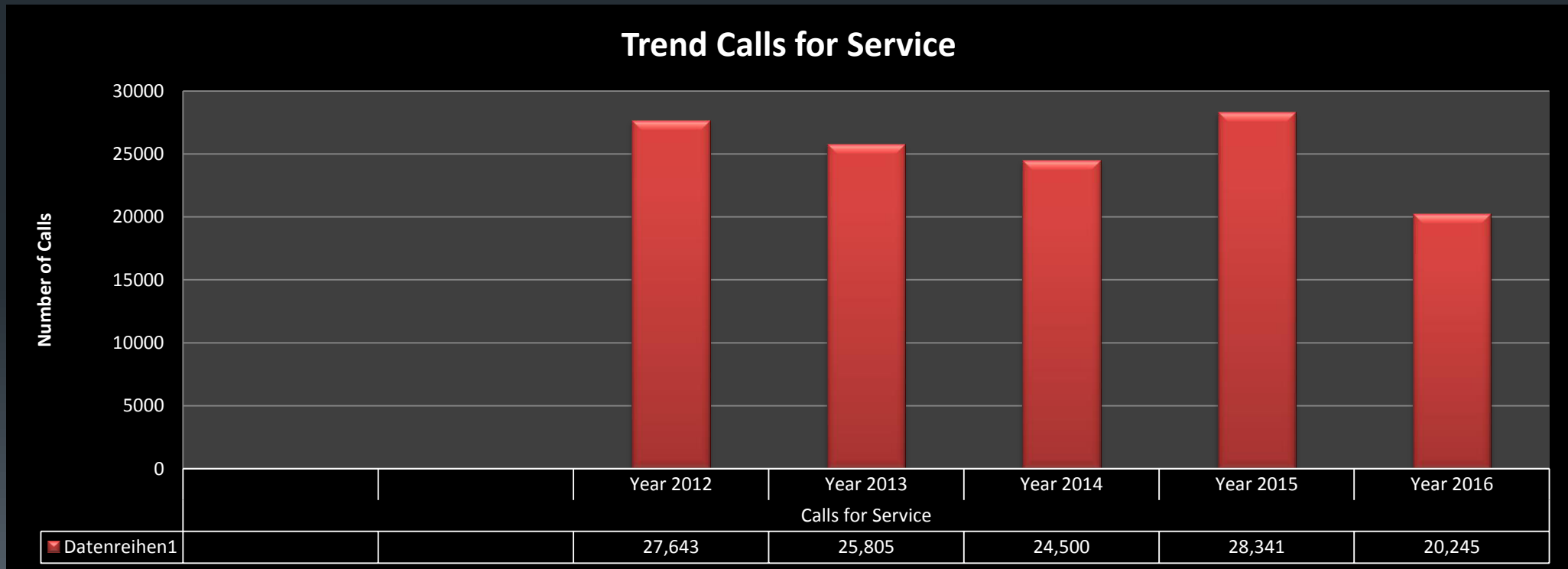

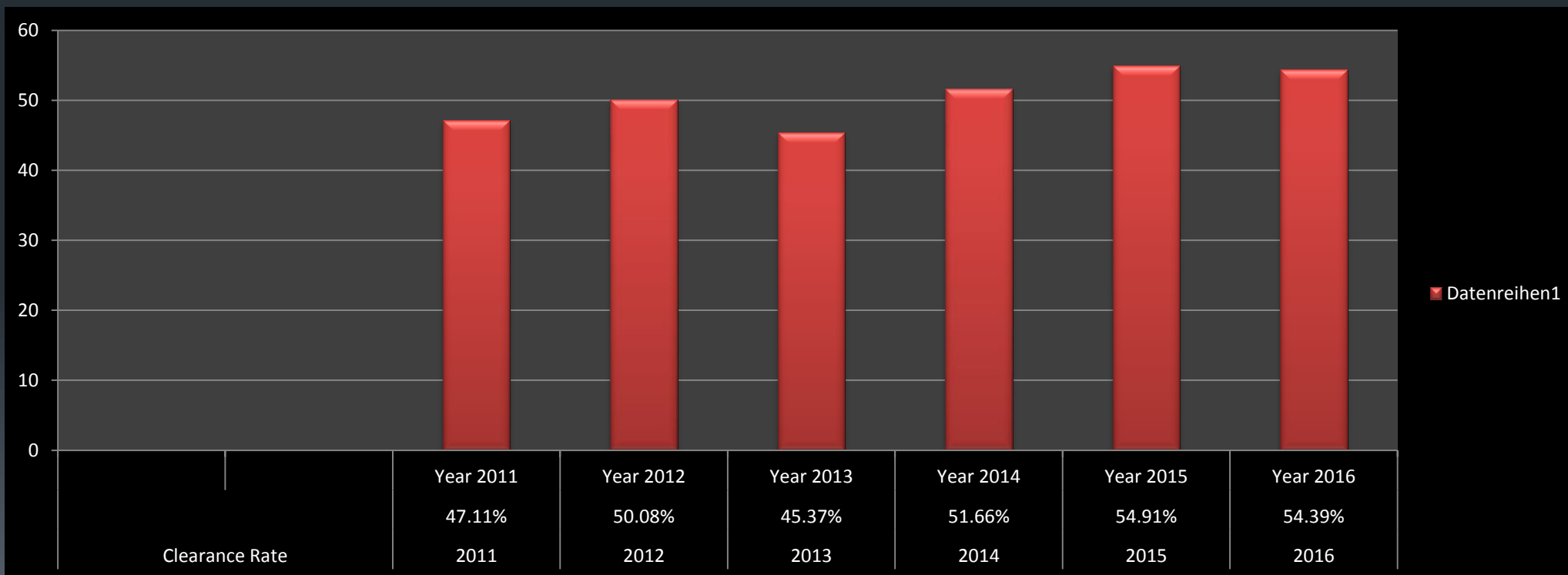
Theft Trends

Narcotics Division Seizure Totals

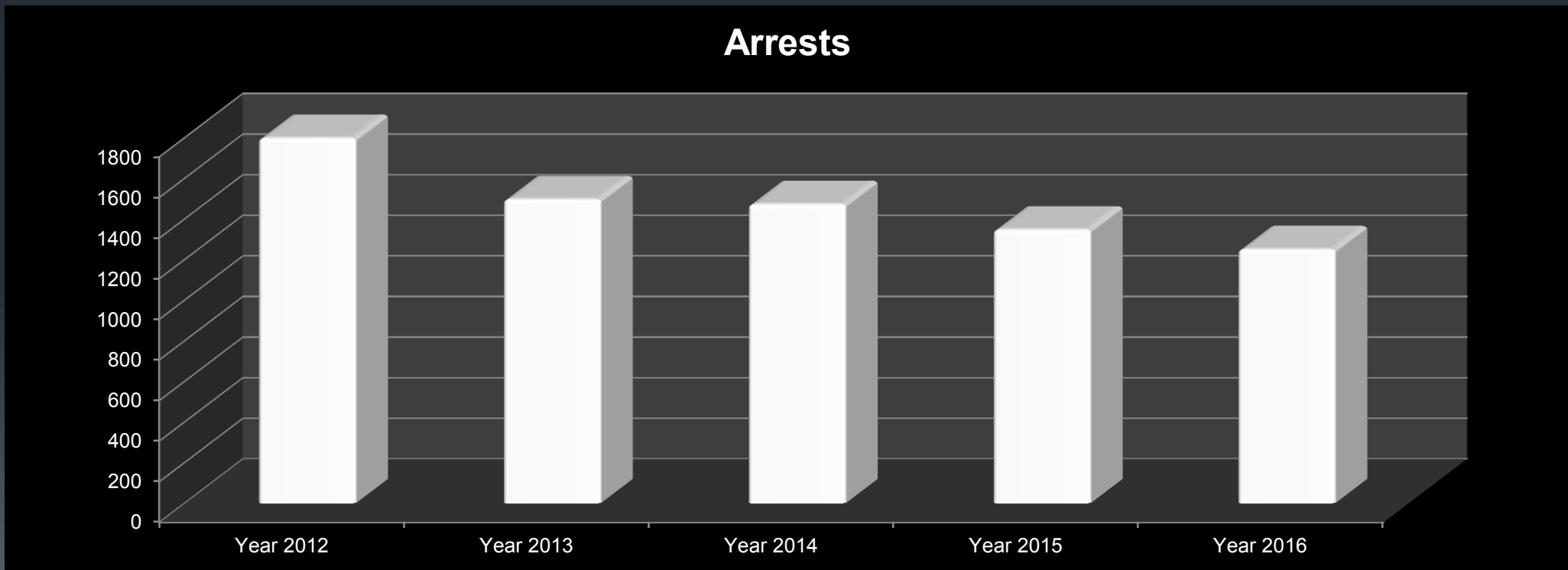
- 38.8 Grams of crack cocaine
- 46.7 Grams of powder cocaine
- 123.8 lbs. of marijuana

- 82.4 lbs. of prescription narcotics received during “Prescription Drug Take-Back” with RCSO.
- 12 firearms
- Total Currency Seized - \$16,299 in joint operations with RCSO
- 3 Vehicles



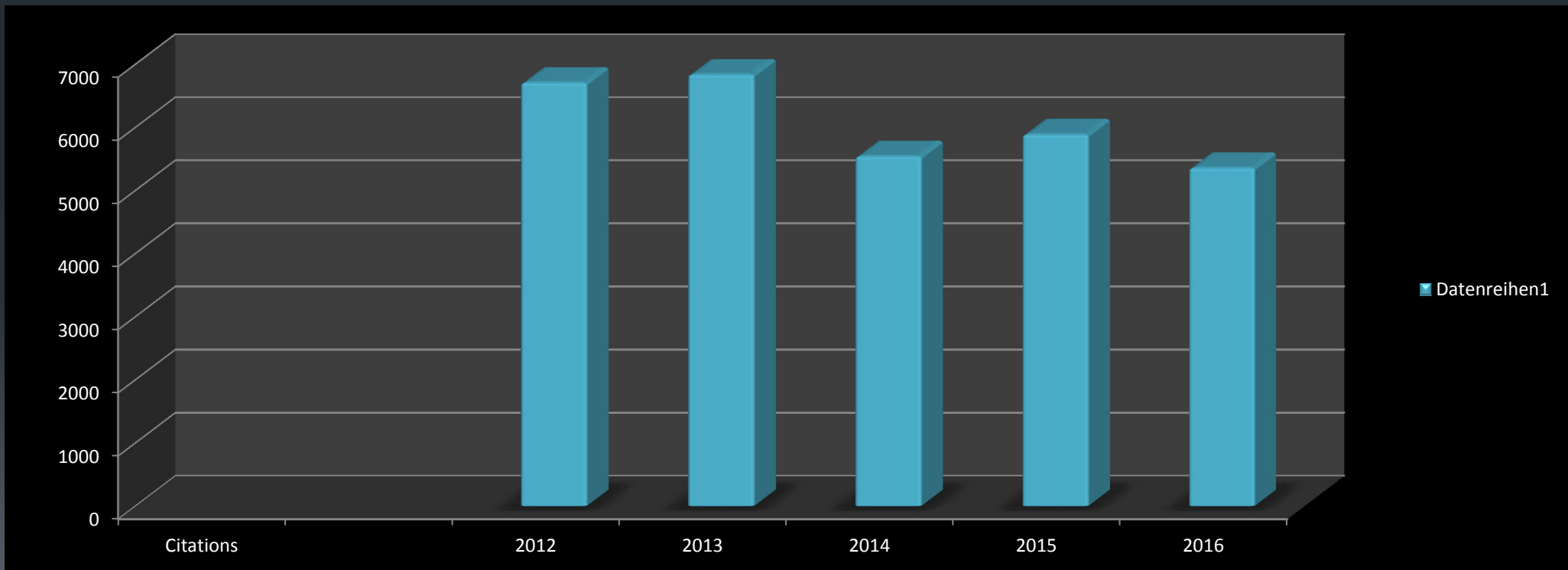
Narcotics Division Arrest Totals

- There were a total of 144 arrests credited to the Narcotics Division.
- 144 Individuals – Charged in state court
- 6 Individuals – Charged in Federal court with assistance from the DEA and ATF. Those charged in federal court will receive longer sentences considering their past violent criminal histories.
- 20 Search Warrants: 6 Search Warrants Served with RCSSO

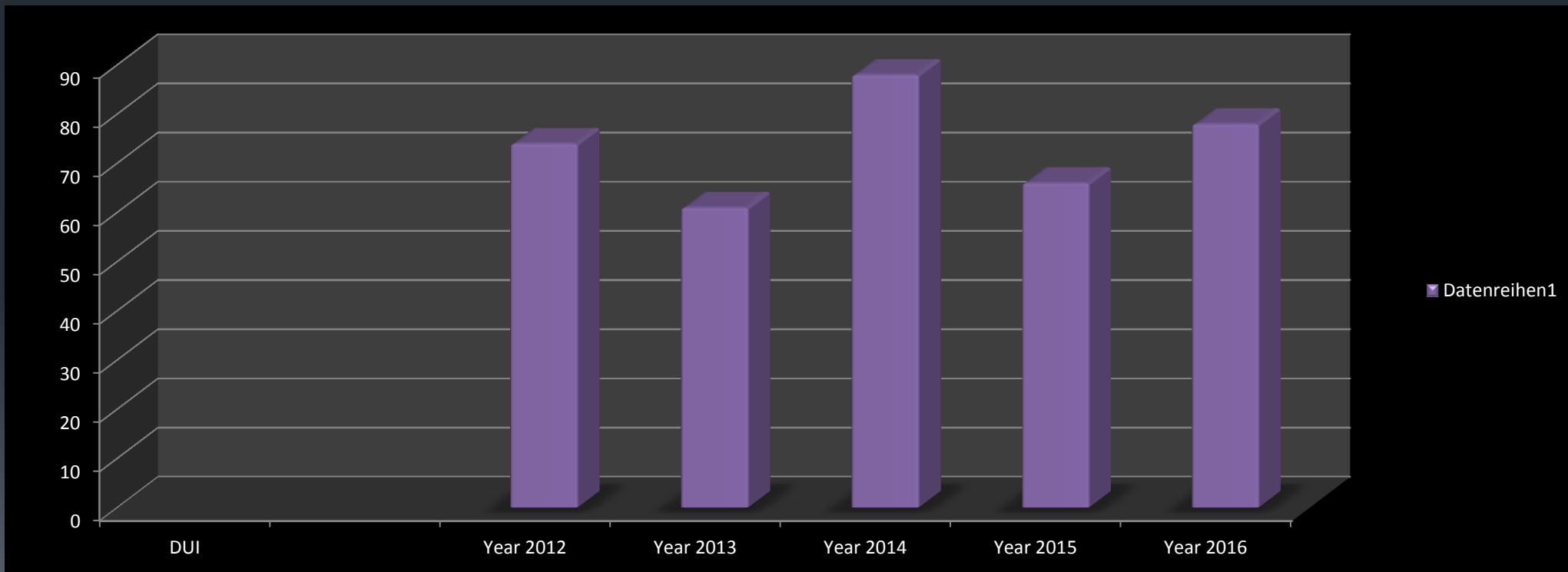

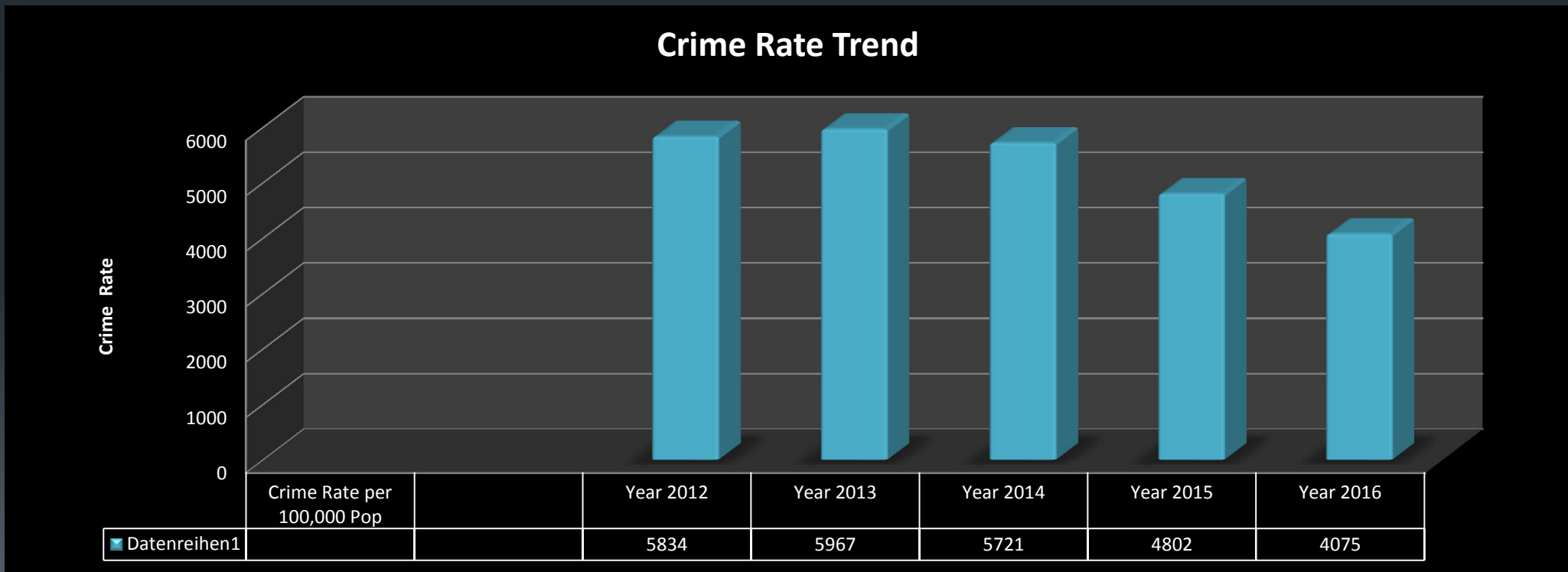
Citations

Challenges

- Criminals don't stay in jail or prison very long... we are already dealing with violent offenders who were arrested and incarcerated in 2014 and 2015. "Prison is graduate school for criminals." It is a long term chess game.

Animal Care and Control

2016 Annual Report

- 
- Before 2013, kennels were frequently at capacity, and animals were being euthanized weekly (Average of 629 Animals/Year)
 - Animal Control was a disposal system for unwanted animals
 - 19 Animals per year were being adopted by Rescues

- Euthanasia has become a last resort, and its use is typically for ill or aggressive animals
- Social media and partnerships have greatly increased the preservation of lives



2015-16 Changes

- Replacing fencing, pouring concrete, and adding shelter to the Overflow facilities
- Adding drainage and concrete channels to eliminate waste and improve sanitation
- Replacing dog houses
- Addressing HVAC and Lighting in the facility
