Weapons/Firearms Policy

The Robertson County Senior Center is a weapon-free campus. Weapons of any kind are strictly prohibited on the main campus, in vehicles on campus and at center sponsored events. A weapon includes any device defined by statue or the center that, if used in a manner intended, is capable of producing death, harm or bodily injury to person or property. Such devices include, but are not limited to: guns(including starter pistols, paintball guns, those that shoot projectiles including pellets, BBs, airsoft beads, potatoes, etc.), explosives, ammunition, knives with blades longer than three(3) inches, slingshots, martial arts weapons, and bow and arrow combinations (including Crossbows).

In the interest of public safety, the weapon-free campus policy includes items resembling weapons including, but not limited to: replica, non-firing, rubber, plastic, and/or toy guns.

Those possessing permits to carry concealed weapons in public are subject to this policy and are prohibited from bringing weapons onto campus or campus facilities.

Weapons are not permitted on campus property, including possession or storage by an individual, in a center facility or in vehicle on center property. As described in TCA 39-17-1313

Exceptions to this policy include uniformed police officers and authorized security personnel. As described in TCA 39-17-1359

Dr. Martin Luther KÏNG,JR.

To honor King's legacy, citizens across the country often view the third Monday in January as a day of service and volunteer at organizations in need. Learn interesting facts you may not have known about this civil rights leader by checking out the illustration below.



{ Interesting facts } •

Born Michael Luther King, Jr., but changed it to Martin because his father changed his in honor of the founder of the Lutheran denomination.

In 1964, at the age of 35, he was the youngest man to have received the Nobel Peace Prize and donated his \$54,123 prize money to the civil rights movement.

He became the first black American to be honored as Time Magazine's Man of the Year.

King is the subject of U2's song "Pride (In the Name of Love)," which reached #2 on Billboard's Mainstream Rock Singles in 1984.

January 20, 1986 was the first national celebration of King's birthday as a holiday. To date, all 50 states observe the third Monday in January to honor King.

The four-acre Martin Luther King, Jr National Memorial, complete with a 28-foot-tall statue of King, is scheduled to open August 2011, between the Jefferson and Lincoln memorials.

Telephone Reassurance

This program is designed for a participant to receive regular phone calls from a volunteer to insure the safety of the senior.

We are continually adding participants to this program. 1.) Some may choose a daily or weekly call 2.) Some may only want this service for a temporary basis, such as while recovering from surgery or injury. 3.) Some would prefer only receiving a call in the event of a weather emergency, such as ice/snow, tornado etc.

We hope to reach as many seniors as possible especially those who are frail, isolated and live alone.
